<p>Funded projects increase numbers of participants reached via education efforts - project increases participant knowledge or skills (social and/or behavioral) around oral health. Should provide specific numbers if possible and describe the source of the data.</p> <p>Funded projects increase participant’s oral health knowledge - project measures the extent that outreach and educational campaigns effectively build awareness and oral health knowledge among the general population. A percentage or specific number who completed pre and post program assessment and the percentage of increased knowledge should be used.</p> <p>Funded research projects expand the knowledge base for the community - project creates publications, curriculum, or tools that are shared with the public.</p>	<p>Funded projects collect data on the number of unduplicated individuals served as a result of funding - project outlines the number of patients served as a result of new or expanded programs or facilities.</p> <p>Funded projects collect data on the number additional services provided as a result of this funding - project outlines the number of treatment services provided as a result of new or expanded programs or facilities.</p> <p>Funded projects focus on Social Determinants of Health - project addresses the social determinants of health (such as health insurance inequalities, education, cultural norms, income, limited access to healthy foods, unemployment, and or transportation).</p> <p>Funded projects create collaborations that coordinate access to wrap-around services - project collects data on the extent and/or number of collaborations to be created or strengthened both within and outside the oral health system. Should include information collected about referrals or other collaborative efforts.</p> <p>Funded programs reach underserved communities - project has a service location within a Dental Health Professional Shortage Area</p>	<p>Funded projects reach system leaders* - projects target system leaders to increase their knowledge or skills around oral health. Should provide specific numbers reached and describe the source of the data.</p> <p>Funded projects deliver new policies and practices by oral health leaders, providers, and/or system agencies - projects working with system leaders to adopt new policies or strategies that positively create social and/or behavior change in oral health.</p> <p>Funded projects offer oral health best practices that are replicated - projects have the ability for replication of evidence-based initiatives or best practices throughout the state of Arkansas.</p> <p>Sustainability - projects ensure the oral health initiative can continue to grow, endure challenges, and is supported by multiple funding sources. Other secured or solicited funders and amounts should be included.</p> <p><i>*System Leaders are defined as direct service providers, administrators, policymakers, and other relevant stakeholders with the ability to influence oral health system changes</i></p>
